



The Rozelle Rail Yards site, once home to an active freight rail line, has not been operational for more than 20 years. As a heavily contaminated site, it is well overdue for a clean-up. The NSW Government is currently planning to commence a range of clean-up activities on the site including:

- Installing erosion and sediment controls
- Searching for and recoding all known services (water, electricity, gas, telco etc) on the site
- Clearing overgrown and noxious vegetation and waste
- Removing the unused railway lines and the remains of derelict buildings.

This clean-up work needs to happen regardless of any future development of the site, including the proposed M4-M5 Link.

Due to the nature of the site including the heavy contamination, an environmental assessment called a review of environmental factors (REF) will be undertaken and put on public display for community comment. This process is likely to commence later this year with a view to commencing the clean-up in the first half of 2017. We anticipate it will take around a year to complete.
