## Water main switch over work – Ramsay Street, Haberfield

Work is underway on WestConnex which involves widening and extending the M4 and M5 and joining them to create a free-flowing motorway network.

The M4 East will extend the existing M4 from Homebush to Haberfield via underground twin tunnels, each 5.5 kilometres in length and among the widest in the southern hemisphere. They will allow for three lanes of traffic in each direction, saving travel time for motorists and taking traffic off local roads. **From Sunday, 11 September 2016**, work to switch to the newly installed water main in Haberfield will occur at the intersections of Ramsay Street and Dobroyd Parade, and Ramsay Street and Alt Street, Haberfield. A map of the work areas is provided overleaf.

The work will take place during the day and night from **8.00 pm Sunday, 11 September 2016 to 11.00 am Friday, 16 September 2016**. Working continuously will ensure the safety of workers and motorists, and limit the impact to water supply. Some properties in Haberfield may experience reduced water pressure as the work is carried out.

The work will involve:

- installing temporary traffic controls including barriers and signage
- Sydney Water draining water from the existing water main
- excavating and breaking rock
- cutting and removing the existing water main pipe, and assembling and laying the new pipe
- installing and testing the new water main connection
- reinforcing, form work, pouring concrete and backfilling the trench
- reinstating the road.

Equipment used during the work will include cranes, trucks, excavators, lighting, heavy machinery, hand tools, and compressors. Loud equipment such as road saws, rock breakers, pipe saws, welders and vacuum trucks will be used intermittently.

During this work, **two eastbound lanes on Ramsay Street will be closed**, however one lane of traffic will continue to operate in each direction. Alt Street, Haberfield will be temporarily closed between Martin Street and Ramsay Street and roads users are encouraged to use the detours shown in the map overleaf and to follow the signage. No bus routes or bus stops are affected by this work.

The existing pedestrian crossing on Ramsay Street near Alt Street will be temporarily closed and a temporary pedestrian crossing will be implemented on Ramsay Street near Walker Avenue. This crossing will be continuously managed by traffic controllers. Traffic control will also be in place to ensure the safety of motorists, residents and workers. Access to properties will be maintained. If you travel along the work route, please allow extra travel time and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signage.

WestConnex is part of a broader transport plan for Sydney which includes improved public transport, such as Sydney Metro and light rail, as well as better, more reliable motorway solutions.
