## Traffic Switch (Stage 3) – M4 Motorway Homebush

Work is underway on WestConnex which involves widening and extending the M4 and M5 and joining them to create a free-flowing motorway network.

The M4 East will extend the existing M4 from Homebush to Haberfield via underground twin tunnels, each 5.5 kilometres in length and among the widest in the southern hemisphere. They will allow for three lanes of traffic in each direction, saving travel time for motorists and taking traffic off local roads. From **Sunday, 5 March 2017** work will commence on the M4 Motorway to shift sections of the east and westbound carriageways between Homebush Bay Drive and Underwood Road. These shifts are required to create space in order to facilitate the construction of the new M4 Westbound off-ramp to Homebush Bay Drive and construction of tunnel portals near Pomeroy Street pedestrian bridge. This work will be undertaken **Sunday to Friday between 10.00 pm and 5.00 am** in order to reduce impacts on road users and ensure the safety of workers and motorists.

This work is expected to take up to **thirty five nights** to complete, weather permitting and will include:

- removing existing line marking
- relocate and pin down median and shoulder barriers
- pavement works (mill and resheet)
- installing new line marking and traffic signage on the M4.

There will be some noise associated with this work, however every effort will be made to minimise the impact of work, including by using low-tonal reversing beepers on machinery during night works, turning off equipment and vehicles when not in use, directing noisy equipment away from residences where possible, and undertaking regular noise monitoring to ensure levels are being managed effectively.

Equipment used will include excavators, bobcats, road/concrete saws, jackhammers, pavement profiler, asphalt pavers, compactors, vacuum excavation trucks, cranes, light vehicles and trucks, concrete trucks, semi-trailers, lighting towers, and hand tools.

During the work, the M4 motorway east and westbound carriageways will be closed between Parramatta Road, Concord and Homebush Bay Drive, Homebush. If you travel along this route for work, please allow extra travel time and follow the signage and the direction of traffic controllers.
