



## Night/weekend work and new traffic lights and changed conditions at the intersection of Sydney Park Road, Euston Road and Huntley Street Alexandria from Monday 5 November

The existing roundabout at the intersection of Sydney Park Road, Euston Road and Huntley Street is being upgraded to a signalised traffic intersection operated by traffic lights from **5am on Monday 5 November**.

Day and night work will be carried out in preparation for the installation and activation of traffic lights in this location. This preparation night and weekend work is detailed in community notification N.523 which can be found online at [www.westconnex.com.au/projects/new-m5](http://www.westconnex.com.au/projects/new-m5) under 'Local updates'.

This preparation weekend work was scheduled to take place from Friday 26 October to Monday 29 October and was postponed until Friday 2 November to Monday 5 November.

### What we're doing

We are installing a signalised traffic intersection operated by traffic lights. This involves removing the existing roundabout and medians, relocating and installing concrete barriers, removing the current line marking, placing new asphalt on the road surface and carry out new line marking to reflect the changed traffic conditions.

### Major traffic changes

From **5am on Monday 5 November**, traffic lights will be in operation at the intersection of Sydney Park Road, Euston Road and Huntley Street.

This set up is a step towards building the upgraded intersection and will remain in place for approximately 9 months. The realignment of the intersection will allow us to move the work areas to allow completion of the new road pavement in sections around the traffic intersection.

Traffic changes in place from Monday 5 November for approximately 9 months.

- Sydney Park Road – No right turn on to Euston Road (south)
- Huntley Street – No right turn on to Euston Road (north)
- Euston Road (south) – southbound only (existing traffic movement)

- Access to Euston Road (south) via McEvoy Street/Euston Road (north) and via Burrows Road northbound and Huntley Street westbound.
- Vehicles travelling from Princes Highway to Euston Road detour via Canal Road eastbound, Burrows Road northbound and Huntley Street westbound.

### How this affects you

Equipment used during the preparation night/weekend work will include excavators, concrete saw cutter, roller, plate compactor, asphalt paver, line marking machine, crane, vacuum trucks, construction trucks, hand tools, light vehicles, lighting towers and generators. The site compounds on Euston Road and on May Street St Peters will be used intermittently throughout the work for storage of materials and vehicle parking.

During the weekend work, traffic controllers will be in place around the work area and on surrounding streets to direct pedestrians and motorists. Please expect traffic delays.

The work is expected to create noise impacts to nearby residents. Every effort will be made to minimise noise and light spill associated with this work by scheduling noisy work, such as concrete saw cutting, to take place early in the night where possible, installing noise blankets around the work areas, turning off equipment and vehicles when not in use, using non-tonal reversing beepers on all machinery and directing noise generating equipment and lights away from residential properties where possible.

Motorists are advised to drive to the conditions and follow the directions of signs and traffic control. Please expect traffic delays while motorists adjust to the changed traffic conditions.
