



Construction work is required for the Permanent Variable Message Sign on Princes Highway at Cooks River, Tempe

Further to notification 515 - the construction work for the permanent electronic variable message sign (VMS) will occur on Thursday, 15 November 2018 (weather permitting).

The location of the VMS has been selected to:

- minimise impact to private property
- provide sufficient time for road users to read, understand and follow the message on the sign
- avoid conflict with existing road signs
- ensure safe access for maintenance crews
- comply with Roads and Maritime Services technical specifications

The VMS will support the efficient operation of the road network by providing real-time information about changes to road conditions due to accidents and unplanned traffic incidents, bad weather, as well as planned events. This will enable road users to make informed decisions about their journeys.

What we're doing

Construction will include:

- **Investigation work (finding services) - one night only Thursday, 15 November 2018**

Further work activities below will be notified prior to commencement.

- Site set-up including barriers and fencing placed around work site
- Levelling of reserve verge
- Footing installation including concrete pour
- Piling work
- Trenching to install power and communications services
- Site reinstatement - reinstate verge, remove barriers and some of the fencing
- VMS sign installation - erecting of VMS pole and outreach arm
