



Nightwork at M5 East, Arncliffe

Night work is required during the M5 East shutdown at the on and off ramps at Princes Highway and Marsh Street, Arncliffe.

What we're doing

Activities for the February shutdown will include:

- Gantry work including footing excavation and concrete work at Marsh St
- Tree removal at Princes Highway and Marsh Street
- Service investigation
- Edge protect and footpath construction
- Road sweeping
- Demolition of concrete barrier
- Crane lift for pile cage delivery at Princes Highway

This work will be carried out over four nights during the existing M5 East maintenance shutdown period from Sunday 17 February to Wednesday 20 February 2019 (weather permitting). These works will be undertaken outside of normal construction hours for the safety of workers and motorists.

Equipment used will include excavators with rock breaker, concrete cutters, truck mounted coring machine, cranes, trucks, elevated work platforms, vacuum trucks, road sweepers, concrete agitators, lighting towers, electric hand tools, chainsaws, wood chipper and compressors as well as other construction vehicles.

How this affects you

Some of this work will be noisy, however noise monitoring will be conducted for all activities undertaken outside of standard construction hours. Any dust generating activities will be watered down to minimise dust. Traffic control and signage will be in place to assist road users through these changed traffic conditions.
