A reminder that night work will be undertaken in sections of the road verge, on the M5 East between Bexley Road and King Georges Road to progress construction of the New M5.

Moving forward Ventia Boral have made changes to their maintenance calendar by splitting the regular four consecutive nights of work over a number of separate dates or adding additional dates to their calendar.

What we're doing

Activities for the May shutdown/s will include:

- Gantry concrete and excavation work at Marsh St
- Gantry electrical work and alignment
- Installation of temporary signage
- Installation of noise wall panels
- Service investigation
- Edge protect and footpath construction
- Road sweeping

This work will be carried out during the existing M5 East maintenance shutdown period (weather permitting) and will be undertaken outside of normal construction hours for the safety of workers and motorists.

Equipment used will include excavators with rock breaker, hydro blaster, concrete cutters, truck mounted coring machine, cranes, elevated work platforms, vacuum trucks, road sweepers, concrete agitators, concrete pumps, lighting towers, electric hand tools, chainsaws, and compressors as well as other construction vehicles.
