Community Grant Scheme guidelines

The WestConnex Community Grant Scheme has been established to effectively support and deliver positive and lasting outcomes for communities located within close proximity to WestConnex.

The scheme provides grants for community initiatives delivering a sustainable legacy with lasting benefits to the local economy, community or natural environment.

Our Community Grant Scheme is aligned to the WestConnex Sustainability Strategy and supports initiatives focused on delivering outcomes in:

- Health and safety
- Environment, sustainability and cultural heritage
- Education and economic development.

Funding

Grant funding of up to \$10,000 is available.

Applicants must demonstrate in their application their ability to raise the remaining required funds should their initiative cost more than \$10,000 to deliver, or if partial grant funding was provided through our scheme.

There are limited funds available, so not all applicants that meet the criteria will receive funding. Preference will be given to first time applicants.

Eligible organisations and groups can only receive grant funding from the scheme once per financial year. An applicant can seek funding for one initiative only. Unsuccessful applicants are welcome to reapply in future rounds if the organisation and initiative satisfies the eligibility requirements.

Grant funds must be expended within six months of the grant being awarded unless otherwise agreed with WestConnex.

Previous grant applicant, the Children's Hospital at Westmead, received a grant to invest in iSimulate equipment which is vital for education and training in the Paediatric Intensive Care Unit. Through this simulation, both medical and nursing staff are able to learn how to respond in real life situations and improve practice.

Application process

Applications for a grant must be made by completing the online application form.

This will be made available via our website once a grant round opens.

Applicants will receive an email confirming receipt of their application once it has been submitted.

Applications must be submitted by 3pm AEST on the closing date. Submissions made after the closing time and date will not be accepted.

Assessment and notification process

Applications will be assessed through a two-step process:

1. Screening

Initial screening of applications will be undertaken to check the organisation and initiative meets the eligibility criteria.

2. Assessment

Applications will be assessed against the assessment criteria.

Any application that does not meet the requirements of step one will not proceed to step two.

Applicants may be required to meet with WestConnex representatives to discuss their application during the assessment process.

Applicants will be notified via email of the outcome of their application within 12 weeks of the round closing date.

Eligibility

The Community Grant Scheme is for grassroots organisations only. To be eligible for funding:

- The applicant must be a:
 - ✓ Community trust
 - ✓ Incorporated community association
 - ✓ Not-for-profit
 - ✓ Social enterprise
 - ✓ Charity
 - ✓ Public Benevolent Institution
 - ✓ School.
- The initiative must directly benefit communities located within close proximity to WestConnex. Refer to the adjacent list for eligible suburbs. Your initiative must benefit communities in one or more of these suburbs.

Not eligible for funding

- ✗ Individuals
- ✗ For-profit organisations, including businesses
- ✗ Government departments (excluding schools)
- ✗ Social groups and clubs
- ✗ Licenced clubs with gaming facilities
- ✗ Political or socially-divisive groups, initiatives or events
- ✗ Religious organisations
- ✗ Events, including fundraisers, performances, conferences, symposiums and sports competitions
- ✗ Initiatives that may involve a conflict of interest or probity issue for procurement
- ✗ Chairs, endowments or scholarships sponsored by academic or non-profit institutions
- ✗ Administration and operating costs
- ✗ Initiatives that have already occurred or are taking place
- ✗ Initiatives not directly benefiting communities located within close proximity to WestConnex.

Assessment criteria

Applications will be assessed against the following criteria:

1. Contribution to our sustainability focus areas

Ability of the initiative to deliver positive community outcomes in at least one of the following focus areas:

- **Health and safety:**
Initiatives delivering health, wellbeing and safety outcomes
- **Education and economic development:**
Initiatives delivering education, skills building, local procurement, economic development and employment access outcomes
- **Environment, sustainability and cultural heritage:**
Initiatives delivering place making, environmental, conservation, sustainability, arts, and cultural heritage outcomes.

2. Connecting communities

Ability of the initiative to connect people with their community and encourage community participation and new volunteers.

3. Legacy

Ability of the initiative to deliver a sustainable legacy with lasting benefits to the local economy, community or natural environment.

4. Helping people within close proximity to our work

Ability of the initiative to deliver lasting benefits to communities located within close proximity to WestConnex.

Additional consideration will be given to initiatives that support disadvantaged or underprivileged people within the eligible communities, as well as the proximity of the community benefiting from the initiative to our works.

Consideration will also be given as part of the assessment as to whether an applicant has previously received funding through the Community Grant Scheme.

Terms and conditions

Applications and subsequent funding through the Community Grant Scheme is subject to Terms and Conditions, which are available on our website westconnex.com.au/grants

Please carefully read the Terms and Conditions before applying. In applying, applicants are deemed to have accepted the Terms and Conditions.

Application support

Applicants must submit a well considered and developed application that addresses all criteria, answers all questions and provides the documentary evidence and support required.

We are committed to supporting applicants through the application process. Please contact us if you require assistance or guidance.

We may initiate discussions with groups or organisations regarding initiatives potentially eligible for grant funding. These initiatives will still be put through the assessment process to ensure transparency in funding decisions.
